### 2025 / 2026 GOLF RULES & REGULATIONS

The following Golf Rules are in effect for the golf calendar year. Wherever *Member* is referenced in this guide, the reference is to any Active Golf Membership.

After careful consideration of Member concerns submitted to the Club, we have instituted a code of conduct for Members, Guests, and Families to protect both the golf course and those who are on it.

The following is a summary of positive, proactive regulations developed to heighten your enjoyment of the course at Stone Canyon. Members will be held accountable for violations up to and including suspension of privileges or termination of Membership.

#### **GOLF RULES**

- Bringing outside alcohol on property / course is expressly forbidden.
- No Member or guest may take range balls from any practice facility for use on the golf course.
- Any tee time of more than four (4) players must be approved by the Golf Staff.
- Members must put player's names into groups at the time of registration.
- Members, guests, and family must follow the posted on-course cart rules.
- All Stone Canyon golf carts may only be occupied by up to two (2) players.
- All Members, guests, and family must follow the posted dress code regulations while on the property. Highlighted further on page 29.
- Showing respect to all Members of the Club and all employees of the Club is expected at all times. Any verbal abuse or worse will be met with a zero-tolerance policy.
- Prior to 11:00am, pace of play should not exceed 4 hours and 10 minutes from your tee time. After 11:00am, the accepted pace of play is 4 hours and 20 minutes. You are expected to keep pace with the group in front of you throughout your round of golf regardless of your tee time. On-course marshals will assist the enforcement of this policy.
  - 1. First time out of position, the group must improve their position relative to the group in front of them AND their tee time within the play of their next two (2) holes.
  - 2. Second warning with the group still out of position, the group must pick up their golf balls and move forward to their correct position on the course.
  - 3. If, after falling behind the acceptable pace again, the group will be asked to leave the golf course.

# **Tee Time Reservations**

- The hours of golf course play, practice facility hours, and Golf Pro Shop hours will be posted on ForeTees and are subject to change depending on golf course and weather conditions. The Golf Course Superintendent, in consultation with the Director of Golf shall determine when the golf course is playable and such decision shall be final. No golf course play shall be permitted during any period that the course is determined not to be fit for play or when the golf course and practice facilities are closed.
- All tee time reservations will be designated in ForeTees. Members may make their tee times on-line or the Golf Staff will gladly assist in making times. Tuesday Sunday is a lottery draw. Members may submit their requests beginning each Tuesday at 12:01pm when the lottery opens until the following Tuesday at 7:00am. These requests are for the following Friday through Thursday. Tee times will be assigned via lottery draw before 12:00pm that same Tuesday. After the lottery is complete, after 12:01pm all remaining tee times are open for direct booking on-line or by calling the Golf Pro Shop.

#### **Example**

- Mondays → Open-play 12:00 PM shotgun (maximum of 120 players).
  - i. Sign-Ups for open play shotguns on Monday will operate just like booking a normal, non-lottery tee time.
- Tuesday–Sunday → Lottery draw for tee times.
- Lottery requests and Monday shotgun requests may be submitted starting each **Tuesday** at 12:01 PM until the following **Tuesday** at 7:00 AM. These requests cover the **Friday**—**Thursday** block of days.
- Tee times are assigned via lottery after 7:00 AM Tuesday. Any remaining times may then be booked directly online after 12:01pm or through the Golf Shop after 12:01pm.
- November 4 (12:01PM) November 11 (7:00AM): Request tee times for Nov. 14-20.
- November 11 (12:01PM) November 18 (7:00AM): Request tee times for Nov. 21-27.
- When booking through the lottery system, Members may make tee time requests for up to five (5) groups. Names must be provided for each tee time and any duplicate names will be deleted.
- Sports Members in good standing may play up to four (4) rounds of golf at Stone Canyon per calendar year. The Sports Member will pay the designated Sports Member Guest Fee and Cart Fee for each round. Practice facilities may be enjoyed on the same day of the





scheduled tee time. Sports Members may not access the golf facilities as Extended Family Members or Member Guests.

- Family Guest policy is as follows:
  - i. Definition- Relatives of the Membership holder consist of Grandparents, Parents, and Grandchildren. It does not include brothers, sisters aunts, uncles.
  - ii. Family guests must be accompanied by their primary Member to qualify for the family rate- if not, they will be subject to the Unaccompanied rate.
- All starting times are made initially via the lottery system. After the lottery draw, remaining available tee times are assigned on a first come, first serve basis. The person making the tee time is responsible for the tee time.
- The golf course and practice facilities may be reserved for Men's or Women's play on certain days and certain hours. Other players will be accommodated during these times on a space available basis only. In addition, during certain events, the golf course and all practice facilities may be closed except to event participants.
- Specific golf course rules and restrictions are applied and published periodically and are available in the Golf Pro Shop.
- Before 2:30pm, all singles and twosomes will be automatically paired together to maximize Member play opportunities. If you desire to play as only one or two players, please sign up for after 3:00pm.

# Check - In / Registration

All Member's guests must register in the Golf Pro Shop before beginning play. Either Members or their guests are responsible for the payment of all cart and guest fees before beginning play. If guests do not check-in, all guest fees will be charged to the Member's account.

All play starts on Hole #1 unless permission to the contrary is obtained from the Golf Professional Staff or is indicated on the ForeTees daily tee sheet.

# **Driving Range**

### **Driving Range – South End Operations**

Each year, this section of the range has required periodic closure for turf recovery due to heavy use. To help maintain grass quality and extend availability, the following adjustments will be in place:

- Tuesdays–Sundays: Four (4) hitting stations will be available for Member use only.
  - Daily Closure: The south tee will close at 3:00 PM each day.
    - Mondays: Closed all day.

We appreciate your cooperation as we work to provide an improved playing surface throughout the season.





# Fall Kickoff Golf Event Saturday, November 8<sup>th</sup> 9:00am Shotgun

#### **Format: Four-Person Scramble**

This is a BLIND DRAW (A, B, C, D player) scramble. Each player tees off and the team selects the best drive. Each team member then plays a second shot from the spot where the best drive lay. The ball may be placed within one club length and must remain in the same condition through the green (including sand bunkers and desert) and within six inches on the putting surface no closer to the hole. This process is repeated until the ball is holed. For those teams with fewer than four players, one player will play two shots at every ball position with each team member taking turns as the player to play two shots. (Player "A" plays two drives, player "B" plays two second shots, player "C" plays two third shots, etc.)

**Teeing Ground:** Men will play from the Blue Tees. (White – If specified by "85 rule")

Women will play from the **Red Tees.** (Green – If specified by "85 rule")

**Handicap:** A player = 20%, B player = 15%, C player = 10%, D player = 5%

**Entry Fee:** \$75.00 per player

Food & Beverage: Breakfast will be provided prior to play starting at 8:00am.

Lunch and awards immediately following in the restaurant.

**Payouts:** 1<sup>st</sup> Gross and Net finishers based on size of field.

Parimutuel wagering available.





### 2025 Stone Canyon Cup

Day 1 - Friday, November 21st

Day 2 – Saturday. November 22<sup>nd</sup>

9:00 Shotgun Both Days

<u>Format:</u> One half of the field competes against the other half of the field in 2-Person-team Scrambles – Match Play Format – Captains are determined by the lowest indexes on each side.

Once the event is closed for entries, participants will be split into two teams equally by handicap. The team captains will then determine the matches played.

Each player tees off and the team selects the best drive. Each team member then plays a second shot from the spot where the best drive lies. The ball may be placed within one club length and must remain in the same condition through the green (including sand bunkers and desert) and within six inches on the putting surface no closer to the hole. This process is repeated until the ball is holed or conceded.

Each match is worth 3 points. Front side, back side, and overall. If the overall is all square after 18 holes, each team will be awarded a ½ point for the overall.

**Pairings Party:** Wednesday, November 19<sup>th</sup> at 5:00pm. Hors d'oeuvres and subscription cocktails at the bar.

Captains will announce teams, partners, and match schedules.

**Teeing Ground:** Men will play from the Blue Tees (White – If specified by "85 rule")

**Women** will play from the **Red Tees.** (Green – If specified by "85 rule")

**Handicap:** 35% of the Low Course Handicap plus 15% of the High Course Handicap will determine the

team handicap. Strokes wheeled off the low team.

**Entry Fee:** \$135 per person

**Food & Beverage:** Food will be provided after play both days.

**Payouts:** One Side Wins and is paid an equal credit book share of the total pool.





## The Guillotine Team Match Play Pairings Party – Wednesday, December 3

<u>Teams:</u> Two Person Teams "BLIND DRAW FOR PARTNERS" Field will be split into two groups, "A" and "B" based on handicap index. Each two person team will consist of a blind draw of an "A" player and a "B" player.

Entry Fee: \$45 per PLAYER. Optional \$40 Cash Team Buy-in paid to 1-4 places (must be paid before 1st round match)

Flights: The first 32 teams for the Men's division and the first 16 teams for the Ladies' division.

<u>Scheduling Matches:</u> Teams are responsible to set the date and time of each match. If a match has not been played by the deadline, opponents may compare scorecards, or a coin toss will determine the match winner. **Please let the Professional staff know when a match has been scheduled.** 

<u>Format</u>: Two Person Scramble Match Play. Minimum 2 drives per player on the first nine holes played.

Tees: Ladies: Red Tees

Men: 0-9 Handicap = Black Tees, 10-19 Handicap = Blue Tees, 20 and higher = White Tees

<u>Handicaps</u>: Handicaps will be set at the beginning of each round. 35% of the low player and 15% of the high, wheeled off the low team handicap within the match.

# Tournaments, Rules of Play, Partners Golf, and Ties

- Stone Canyon reserves the right to make the golf course and practice facilities available for tournaments and clinics, at which time use by non-participants may be restricted.
- Participation in any sanctioned golf tournament or event is defined in this Golf Guide.
- Scorecards for tournament play at Stone Canyon must be completed, signed, and attested to by the opposing player(s), and turned into the Stone Canyon Golf Staff immediately after completion of your round for verification. Golf Genius will be used as an electronic live scoring only and will not be used to determine official scoring. If there are any discrepancies between scorecards and Golf Genius, the written scorecard settles any discrepancy.
- The entry fee for any event is subject to change depending on selection and cost of any food items, gifts, etc.
- Cancellations that occur after the cancellation deadline are responsible for any portion of the entry fee that is an unrecoverable expense. (Food, tee gifts, prizes, flight payout)
- If an event does not meet the required minimum amount of participation, the Director of Golf has the discretion to cancel the event and open the tee sheet for daily Member play.
- Except for any event advertised to the contrary, tournament entries are on a first come, first serve basis. If a tournament is over-sold, entries will be placed on the waitlist in the order they are received.
- All tournament participants must have an established handicap index.
- The Director of Golf and the Club have the right to modify the format of an event.
- The Stone Canyon Golf professional Staff determines the Handicap Revision Dates for each event.
- No golf tournaments of any kind or play by any group of five (5) or more persons shall be permitted unless approved in advance by the Golf Professional Staff.

### **Tournament Awards**

After each tournament event, the winner's credit amounts will be entered into their appropriate credit book. Thereafter, when a Member makes a merchandise purchase, they must request to use the credit book dollars, and the amount will be subtracted from the amount in the credit book.





#### **Rules of Play**

- ➤ USGA rules will govern all play in conjunction with Stone Canyon's local rules.
- ➤ All disputes will be settled by the Director of Golf and/or the Tournament Committee whose decision will be final.
- ➤ The maximum handicap index that can be allocated to a golfer is 36, unless otherwise noted by the Tournament Committee or the Conditions of the Competition.
- ➤ Unless a playoff is specified in the rules of a specific tournament, ties will be broken by a scorecard playoff. The USGA recommended procedure of matching scorecards is as follows: The winner will be determined based upon comparing the best total (gross or net) score for the last nine (9) holes of the event. If a tie still exists, compare last six (6) holes, the last three (3) holes, and finally, the 18<sup>th</sup> hole if necessary. If a tie still exists, the matched scorecards will go to the number one (1) handicap hole and proceed until a winner is determined.
- Local Rule E5 provides the player with the opportunity to not have to play a provisional ball. It is a relatively easy to understand application: When a player tees off and the shot goes into the desert, the player identifies the approximate area the ball would have been and that is Point "A". Then the player identifies the closest edge of the fairway that is no closer to the hole (Point "B"), and the player may drop anywhere in that area between Point "A" and Point "B", adding TWO strokes. (This is essentially the stroke and distance penalty)-- had the player played a provisional ball to the same place, the player would have been laying three (3). NOTE: This rule should not create confrontation about where the ball most likely would be-- if there is a question, the player should always confer with playing partners. Ultimately, it is the player's decision to determine.
- ➤ Drop zones will always be marked for tournament play. A white circle will define and DZ will be painted inside the drop zone.
- ➤ Ground Under Repair will always be marked for tournament play. A white circle will define the drop zone. For G.U.R., proceed to the nearest point of relief, no closer to the hole, and drop within one club-length. No penalty.
- ➤ All Red penalty areas will be identified by a red line or stakes. Please follow Rule 17.
- > Stones in bunkers are considered movable obstructions, you are allowed to move them.
- $\triangleright$  Greenside sprinklers 2 + 2 Rule If a player's golf ball lies off the green, but not in a penalty area, and a sprinkler interferes on the line of play between the ball and the hole,





the player may take relief from a sprinkler head up to one club-length no nearer the hole—provided that the sprinkler is within two club-lengths of the green and the ball lies within two club-lengths of the sprinkler.

### **Partners Golf Events**

For clarification of "Couples" Events—going forward, Stone Canyon will implement the following guidelines—Casual, social, golf events will be designated as "Partners Golf", with the team make-up described as "Teams may consist of any two players. All are welcome—bring your spouse, friend, or fellow Member." "Couples Golf" will be identified as events that "Due to the format and competitive structure, teams shall consist of one male and one female player."

## **Handicaps**

A golf handicap is important because it allows players of different skill levels to compete fairly. It's a numerical measure of a golfer's potential, enabling them to play against each other on a more level playing field, even if their on-course performance varies significantly.

Here's a more detailed look at the importance of a golf handicap:

#### 1. Fairness in Competition:

A handicap allows golfers with varying abilities to compete on a more equal footing. The system essentially adjusts scores based on individual skill levels, so a higher handicap golfer gets extra strokes, making the competition fairer. With handicaps, even recreational golfers can participate in tournaments and friendly wagers with a better chance of success and enjoyment.

#### 2. Tracking Progress:

A handicap is a great way to track your progress in golf. It provides a numerical measure of your improvement over time, showing how your scores are trending relative to the course difficulty. Knowing your handicap can help you choose the appropriate tees to play from on a particular course. A handicap allows you to better understand how you are performing on different courses, as it accounts for the course's difficulty rating (course and slope rating). Having a handicap can make golf more engaging and enjoyable, whether you're playing with friends or in a tournament.

It is a player's responsibility to post scores upon the completion of their 9 or 18-hole round. The Golf Professional Staff monitors scores posted and if a situation arises of scores non-posted, the Staff will address the situation with the individual. If a second incident occurs, the penalty can be up to and including a penalty score of 72. Please post all scores!

# Golf Cart Use & Walking

- a) The use of golf carts on the golf course may be mandatory for all players during certain tournaments.
- b) Golf carts are restricted to use on the golf course and practice facilities. No golf carts shall be removed from the Club Facilities at any time without the prior approval of the Golf Professional Staff.





- c) Golf carts shall be operated only by persons sixteen (16) years of age or older with a valid automobile driver's license.
- d) No more than two (2) persons are permitted on a standard golf cart, except in case of emergency, course evacuation, or at the discretion of the Golf Pro Shop Staff.
- e) Golf carts shall remain on cart paths on all par 3's and whenever else possible. Golf carts shall not be driven within fifteen (15) yards of any tee, bunker, or penalty area and thirty (30) yards from any green. Golf carts should be driven across fairways only at right angles, avoiding soft areas. Golf carts shall not be driven into the desert at any time. Golf carts are to be parked on the cart path prior to putting or teeing on all greens and tees, golf cart traffic and directional signage must be always obeyed.
- f) Golf carts are operated at the risk of the operator. The cost of repairing any damage to golf carts or the golf course resulting from improper or careless operation will be charged to the Member in whose name the operator is playing with at the time the damage occurs.
- g) Private owned golf carts must have an annual inspection sticker, be able to provide proof of insurance, be street legal, and be paid up-to-date on the annual trail fee.
- h) Private owned golf carts are the complete responsibility of the Member owner including but not limited to: maintenance, cleaning, conforming to the existing Stone Canyon fleet, and break-down on course.
- i) The use of privately owned carts follows the same restrictions as the Stone Canyon fleet. Private-owned golf carts are not to "cut across" the golf course but must follow all HOA roads to and from the Clubhouse.

## Walking:

Walking, whether carrying or using a push-cart, is permitted at any time. We ask that you be courteous of your fellow competitors during competition as to be very aware of your pace of play. The Professional Staff has the right to mandate carts for certain events to maintain the appropriate pace of play and enjoyment of all players.

# Pace of Play:

All players are to maintain a reasonable pace of play. Pace of play is a matter of golf etiquette and is a courtesy to your fellow Members. Specifically:

a) Prior to 11:00am, all rounds of golf should be completed in 4 hours and 10 minutes or less and when teeing off after 11:00am, all rounds should be complete in 4 hours and 20 minutes or less.





- b) Players are encouraged to play "ready golf"--- i.e. be prepared when it is your turn, do not wait for "honors", walk with purpose between shots and to your ball.
- c) In Peak season, the Golf Professional Staff will pair ALL twosomes together prior to 2:30pm. This not only maximizes the Member opportunity to play, but it also helps maintain a consistent pace of play.
- d) If your group is off pace and out of position, the Golf Professional Staff will alert you and request your group to speed up and catch up to the group in front of you. If your group continues to hold up your fellow Members, you may be asked to let faster players through or you may be asked to pick up your golf balls and skip a hole(s) until you are at your correct position on the golf course.
- e) A group's position on the golf course is directly BEHIND the group in front of you, not directly in front of the group behind you!

Stone Canyon is making a major effort to combat slow play--- here are some pace of play tips:

- Always play ready golf.
- Prepare for your shot while others are playing.
- Be aware of your handicap and max strokes you can take, pick up when out of the hole.
- Arrive at the first tee 5 minutes prior to your tee time.
- Tee off when it is safe, don't wait for "honors".
- Always keep pace with the group in front of you.
- Minimize your pre-shot routine.
- Use continuous putting and eliminate multiple markings of golf balls.
- Mark scores at the next tee box.
- Park carts at the back of the green.
- On-course marshals are now from the Golf Pro Shop. Marshals use a flag system to alert groups about their position relative to pace of play. When the marshal approaches your group with a green flag, the group's pace is fine. When the marshal approaches your group with a yellow flag, the group's pace is 3-5 minutes behind. When the marshal approaches your group with a red flag, the group's pace is more than 5 minutes behind. If a group receives either a yellow or red flag, the group MUST catch up to the group in front and get back on pace. After the second warning, if the group does not catch up, the marshal will have the group skip a hole (s) to get back into position.





# **Guests:**

- All guests are subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Club, including the pace of play rules. Members are responsible for their guest's activities and behavior at all times, even when not in the company of the Member.
- ➤ During peak season, only 1 guest per Member is allowed prior to 11:00am Fridays through Sundays. Guest restrictions are lifted in the off season.
- ➤ All guests must check-in with the Golf Pro Shop prior to play.

# **Equipment, Dress Code:**

- Each player must have his/her own set of clubs—no sharing of clubs.
- For those who do not have their own clubs, rental sets are reserved through the Golf Pro Shop.

#### Dress Code: Golf Course

Proper Club attire is required of all Members and Guests. Men must wear conforming tops to include: polo shirts with collars, mock necks, or turtlenecks. Proper attire for women is appropriate-length golf or dress shorts, skorts, skirts, or slacks. Collarless shirts must have sleeves and sleeveless shirts must have a collar.

Hats must be worn facing forward.

Clothing items not permitted are as follows: jeans, denim, t-shirts, tank tops, cut-offs, sweatpants, basketball shorts, swimsuits, and anything deemed not appropriate by the Golf Professional Staff.

#### Dress Code: Clubhouse

Proper Club attire is required of all Members and Guests. Men must wear shirts with collars, progressive collars, mock or turtlenecks, and no sleeveless tops. Golf or walking shorts, slacks, and skirts (for women) are considered proper attire. Jeans are permitted inside the Clubhouse, provided they are clean, presentable, and deemed appropriate by Club Managers. Hats and caps are permitted inside the Clubhouse before 5:00pm but must be worn facing forward. Men may not wear hats or caps after 5:00pm inside the Clubhouse; however, hats or caps are permitted on the outdoor patios.





Tee shirts, tank tops, inappropriate jeans, cutoffs, sweatpants, athletic shorts, bathing suits, clothing marked with offensive language or a degrading message, or clothing that is torn or ripped or other attire deemed inappropriate by Club Management are not permitted. Failure to comply will result in termination of Club service.

# **Golf Course Play:**

- Jogging, bicycling, walking, dog-walking, skateboarding, etc. are not permitted on the golf course or cart paths after 8:00am in season and after 7:00am during the Offseason.
- All play shall start at hole number one unless permission to start elsewhere is obtained in advance from the Golf Professional Staff.
- If play is involuntarily discontinued due to weather or closing of the course by the Golf Professional Staff, players will be issued a "rain-check" based on how many holes have been played. Four or fewer holes played- 18-hole rain-check, Five to 13 holes played- 9-hole rain-check, 13 or more holes played- no rain-check.
- Practice is restricted to all designated practice areas on the property. NO
   PRACTICE ON THE GOLF COURSE.
- All players shall repair ball marks on greens, replace or provide sand/seed mix to all divots, and smooth sand upon exiting any bunker.
- Rakes shall be left half in-half out of bunkers to facilitate use by players.
- Players stopping between nines must obtain permission from the Golf Professional Staff to resume play.
- The Rules of Golf adopted by the USGA and the Royal and Ancient shall govern all play, except as modified by The Stone Canyon Club local rules.
- Players shall observe proper golf etiquette at all times.
- The practice are only to be used by Members and their Guests (who are playing that day), as well as by Sports Members immediately prior to their tee time.
- Range balls are not to be removed from the driving range. Penalty for this can be up to suspension.
- Members and Guests will observe all special rules concerning use of the practice areas posted from time to time, including rules regarding the location of specific areas where practice may be temporarily prohibited, and hours of operation.
- Proper golf attire is ALWAYS required while using any of the practice areas.





# **Storms / Inclement Weather**

The Stone Canyon Club does not subscribe to any weather-alert system. Consequently, the Club assumes no responsibility for a player electing to remain on the golf course during storms.

When ominous or dangerous-looking weather approaches, it is the player's responsibility to exit the golf course and/or seek shelter at one of the golf course locations. Should any player choose to remain on the golf course during inclement weather, the player(s) is doing so at his/her own risk.
